## Walk

From the town centre take the route south from West Street to the roundabout at the bottom of the hill. Take the road marked to Seaton and Musbury and follow the pavement on the right passing the turning to the railway station. Turn right at the brick terraced houses and continue down past the builders' merchant,

then take the footpath that leads off to the right before the entrance to the carpet factory. Cross the railway line by the two gates and go through the small wood and the tunnel.

Go through the gate directly ahead and turn to cross the field parallel with the wooded embankment on the right; the river Axe is on the left. At the far end climb the bank by the steps up to the road, go through the gate and cross over. Follow the pavement across the railway bridge and down to the roundabout from where you can return to the town centre.
